Qualifiers

The In-Hand Champion Donkey at this show automatically qualifies for the relevant Championship at the DBS Annual Supreme Championship Show in August 2024 at Moreton Morrell College, Warwickshire, provided it is owned by a fully paid up member of the DBS. A donkey may win more than one Championship at shows but will qualify only once for the DBS Championship Show. Where the In-Hand Champion donkey has previously qualified, the Reserve Champion Donkey will be deemed the Qualifier. If the Reserve Champion has also previously qualified, the judge will select another donkey from the In-Hand Championship line up as the qualifier for the DBS Annual Supreme Championship Show.

Awards

The DBS present a "Best Local Donkey" rosette to the best donkey owned by a DBS member living within a 25mile radius of the showground, to be judged after the In-Hand Championship. Eligible competitors are asked to wear a coloured armband (preferably BLUE).

First Ridden ponies/riders will be asked after the initial walk round to come into the centre of the ring. First Ridden Competitors will only canter in their individual shows. Lead Rein Riders: If a strip section is required a lead rein rider MUST stay mounted. STALLIONS- Either for In Hand or Ridden classes, competitors must be 16 years of age or over. Competitors cannot enter the ring once the command of trot has been given. The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same from qualifier to Grand Finals, unless special circumstances should arise, then it will be left to the discretion of the Directors and Advisory Committee to oversee this

ALL COMPETITORS SHOULD AQUAINT THEMSELVES WITH SSADL RULES BEFORE ENTERING. SSADL rulebook can be found at www.seniorshowinganddressage.co.uk.

2024 Qualification System: SSADL Members will receive their own qualification card. This is to be signed at the time of judging/presentation. This is the members responsibility to ensure the right qualifier is signed for.

- 1. 1st to 6th in each age group will qualify for the London International Horse Show 2nd round qualifiers
- 2. The 1st to 6th from each AGE section will qualify for the SSADL Members Open Challenge (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted). Members Mountain and Moorland Challenge (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted). Members Foreign Breeds Challenge (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted). Members Lead Rein/First Ridden Challenge.
- 3. The 1st to 3rd of each class with qualify for the Senior of Year Championship.

DIRECT ROUTE QUALFIERS – Are OPEN to Members and Non-members HOWEVER, to claim the LIHS ticket a competitor MUST already be a 2024 member. The members MUST produce the membership card or a covering letter from the SSADL Show office to be able to claim the LIHS Ticket. The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same for the Grand Final, unless under special circumstance, then the Directors will intervene. For a competitor to be eligible to compete at the LIHS Senior Showing Grand Final at the ExCel, ALL ponies/horses MUST meet the current FEI Vaccination Regulations.

NOTE -ONCE A COMPETITOR HAS QUALIFIED FOR LIHS IN THE RIDDEN SECTION, THEY ARE NOT ALLOWED TO QUALIFY IN THE IN-HAND SECTION AND VICE VERSA. A competitor/member can still compete in qualifiers but are not allowed in any Championship. Should this arise the 2nd & 3rd will go forward to the day Championship.

No Spurs- with the exception of adult side saddle riders, no galloping/canter extensions, no wearing of face/body jewellery, with the exception of a medical earring. No Foals are permitted in SSADL classes

IN HAND CLASSES: Minimum age of handler = 11yrs

STALLIONS: Either In-Hand or Ridden competitors must be over the age of 16 years.

Grooms must be 16 years of age and over and correctly dressed. LEAD REIN & FIRST RIDDEN COMPETITORS WILL NOT BE REQUIRED TO STRIP. FIRST RIDDEN PONIES WILL ONLY CANTER IN THEIR INDIVIDUAL SHOW.

SSADL AGE BADGES MUST BE WORN BY MEMBERS, FAILURE TO DO SO WILL DEEM DISQUALIFICIATION. ALL STALLIONS MUST WEAR THE SSADL STALLION BADGE.

Competitors cannot enter the ring once the command of trot has been given. The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same whether side saddle or astride from first/second or direct route qualifiers and grand final.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1) All entries must be made either in writing to the Secretary on the requisite form and accompanied by the necessary entry fees or online via www.southsuffolkshow.co.uk. Every exhibitor making entries for the show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Conditions of Entry and it is only on this understanding that entries are accepted.
- 2) Data Protection: It is a condition of entry that the SSAA reserves the right to forward Exhibitor information to the press, Breed Societies and other regulatory bodies (ie DEFRA or Trading Standards). It is also a requirement that the Owner's name will be published in the Show Catalogue. No address details will be listed in the catalogue.
- 3) Equine Influenza: It is expected that all horses and ponies competing should have been vaccinated against equine flu before the show, but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show. The Association's Veterinary Officer will carry out regular checks of the Horse Section and the Stewards, at their direction are empowered to require any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine flu to be immediately removed from the showground. In the event of a serious outbreak the Association reserves the right to require Vaccination certificates to be produced.
- 4) The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 5) The entry fee for any animal entered and not exhibited will be forfeited. Entry fees in respect of all entry cancellations owing to accident or illness will be refunded in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 79.5 and requires confirmation in writing of the cancellation.
- 6) Entries close on Monday 15th April 2024. <u>No</u> entries will be accepted on the day. NO SUBSTITUTIONS or class changes allowed after printing of the catalogue WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE BRITISH SHOWJUMPING CLASSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 79.3. The Association will not be responsible for any error, which may appear in the Catalogue, or for any entry being made in the wrong class.
- 7) Competitors may be disqualified from any class for not observing the rules or causing unnecessary delay to the continuity of the show. A fall of horse/pony or rider in any class will result in disqualification and the rider must leave the ring dismounted. (It is strongly recommended that medical advice be sought before competing in any other class.)
- 8) Ponies competing in this show shall be deemed to be subject to the Rules and Regulations of the relevant affiliated Association/Society under which the class/s are being held.
- 9) i) Horseboxes/trailers are admitted with the relevant vehicle pass and must be parked as directed by Stewards. Cars carrying tack in support of boxes/trailers must enter the Showground through the Horsebox entrance.
 - ii) Every person entering the showground, including drivers of Horse boxes/trailers must have a valid entrance ticket or pay the full price of admission at the gate (£18). This regulation will be strictly enforced. The show will not take responsibility for any tickets, which may have been mislaid or forgotten. No refunds will be considered unless application is made in writing to the Secretary. All persons on leaving the showground who wish to re-enter must obtain a pass from the Gate Stewards. No Pass No Re-Entry unless admission fee is paid.
 - iii) All owners making exhibit applications through an agent and who wish to attend the show will be required to apply in writing to the Secretary by 15thApril 2024 for issue of an exhibitor's ticket. All owners, exhibitors, competitors and attendants will be required to have an exhibitor ticket to gain free access to the showground. No entry will be allowed without a ticket, unless normal gate charges are paid. No refunds will be considered unless application is made in writing to the Secretary.

Additional tickets may be sent at the discretion of the show if more than 6 animals have been entered, please ensure that you have enough tickets. *Additional tickets may be purchased from the Secretary at reduced rates prior to 15th April 2024*.

- 10) Competitor's Numbers, Vehicle Pass and Exhibitors Tickets will be sent by post, prior to the day of the Show.
- 11) No timetable of events will be issued and changes may be made to ring allocations. The Association will not be responsible for exhibits not arriving on time to be judged.

- **12)** If, for any reason, a judge is unable to attend the show or is more than 30 minutes late, the Association reserves the right to appoint a Deputy. Every effort will be made to inform exhibitors.
- 13) i) Prize money will be paid on the day up to 5.30pm, by the Treasurer, only on receipt of the prize card issued in the Ring. Prizes not claimed by this time will be settled by cheque within 28 days on receipt of the relevant prize card by the show. (iii) Should insufficient entries be received for any one class, the Organisers reserve the right to combine two or more classes forward on the Show day.
 - (iv) Classes 16 to 21 are held under British Showjumping Rules and in the event of insufficient starters lower prizes may be withheld in accordance with <u>Rule 76.6.</u>
 - (v) Winners must sign for their Cup or Trophy at the Secretary's Office before taking them from the Showground. All Cup/Trophy winners will be required to return them on request before the next Show. *Special Note:* Competitors are advised that due to past difficulties, any cup won may be collected and signed for only by the winner or member of his/her immediate family.
- 14) Objections must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of £10 handed to the Secretary within five minutes of the finish of the event concerned (or £100 for objections in British Showjumping classes).
- 15) Horses must be walked from the Horsebox parking area to the working in area, collection and show rings, by the horse walkways and defined routes. NO TROTTING OR CANTERING WILL BE ALLOWED in walkways or defined routes. Any breach of this rule may result in the offender being asked to leave the show.
- **16)** Horses when not competing must be kept away from all rings.
- 17) Competitors and Grooms at all times when riding a horse or pony must wear headgear of the relevant British Standard acceptable to the HSE, and their affiliated Association. Such headgear, where applicable, must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened.
- **18)** The playing of ball games or participation in any activity that may excite an animal is **strictly not allowed** within the horse and livestock lines or those areas set aside as practice or exercise areas.
- 19) The Organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone should take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents and must obey the instructions of the Show Committee and all the Officials and Stewards.
- 20) In the event of a competitor, or anyone connected with a competitor, being guilty of improper or abusive behaviour towards his or her animal, any Official of the Association or the general public, the Chairman, Secretary or Show Steward shall have the power to order the offender to leave the Showground and recommend that the Show shall refuse that person's entry for future shows.
- 21) The Association reserves the sole right of decision to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the show. Where such decisions arise, from directive, happenings or circumstances outside the control of the Association, it shall not create liability to claim for loss or damage. The refund of fees will be at the discretion of the Association.
- **22) Disclaimer of Liability:** In this clause, the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Committee, and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground.
 - Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents, the Committee will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his servant or agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to Showground by the said exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises.
 - Save as aforesaid the exhibitor shall indemnify the Committee against all claims, damages, and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the exhibitor, his servant, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the Showground and shall assume full responsibility therefore.

Exhibitors must have insurance against any third party claims and acknowledge that they are taking part in a risk sport and that they are a competent person within the level of competition, which they are about to or be taking part in. Acceptance of the foregoing provision shall be a condition of entry.
