Equine Influenza

Horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show. Random checks of Passports within the Horse section will be carried out by the Association's Veterinary Officer and Senior Stewards, The Association requires that all exhibits are disease free and come from a healthy environment and any horse or pony found to be showing clinical signs of equine flu will be immediately removed from the showground.

Safety

The Organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

It is mandatory for all riders to wear correct riding clothes including a protective helmet manufactured to conform with current approved BSI or European Standards with the chinstrap correctly and securely fastened at all times whilst mounted on the showground. The Club accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.

Riding is only permitted on the routes to and from the rings, in the rings or horse lines, practice area and warm up ring. When not competing horses must be kept away from all rings.

Class

- 1 Best Condition and Turned Out: Donkeys of any age and sex, to be judged 75% condition and 25% turnout. Conformation will not be taken into account.
- 2 Mare, 4 years old and over, and broodmare, 5 years old and over with own foal at foot, foals to be 6 weeks old or over on show day.
- 3 Colt or gelding, two or three years old.
- 4 Filly, two or three years old.
- 5 Yearling colt, gelding or filly.

Please note, if there are insufficient entries forward in the Youngstock classes, these classes may be amalgamated into one class for colts and geldings and one class for fillies.

- 6 Stallion or gelding, four years old or over.
- 7 Veteran Donkey, for donkeys that are 20 years of age or over.
- 8 CHAMPIONSHIP: For 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 2 to 7. Classes are open to everyone whether or not they are members of the Donkey Breed Society, but DBS rosettes can only be awarded to exhibits owned by DBS members.

Qualifiers

The In-Hand Champion Donkey at this show automatically qualifies for the relevant Championship at the DBS Annual Supreme Championship Show in August 2025 at Moreton Morrell College, Warwickshire, provided it is owned by a fully paid up member of the DBS. A donkey may win more than one Championship at shows but will qualify only once for the DBS Championship Show. Where the In-Hand Champion donkey has previously qualified, the Reserve Champion Donkey will be deemed the Qualifier. If the Reserve Champion has also previously qualified, the judge will select another donkey from the In-Hand Championship line up as the qualifier for the DBS Annual Supreme Championship Show.

Awards

The DBS presents:

A "Best Veteran" rosette for the winner of class 7,

A "Best Local Donkey" rosette to the best donkey owned by a DBS member living within a 25mile radius of the showground, to be judged after the In-Hand Championship. Eligible competitors are asked to wear a coloured armband (preferably BLUE). The winner of the best local donkey will also be awarded a photoshoot voucher, presented by **Carol Street Photography**.

All entries must state their SHS registration number, stallion licence number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. Discretionary entry to a stallion class may be allowed in cases where a licence is pending but not yet issued.

All owners entering their horses must be members of the Suffolk Horse Society.

A mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white, and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.). This class to be judged in accordance with the rules for Working Hunter Competitions as laid down by SHB(GB). To be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out. Grade A Showjumpers and Advanced Event horses are not eligible to compete in these Classes. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as of 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes.

The maximum total points available are 100. These are made up of: Jumping points = max 40 points, Style & Presence whilst Jumping = max 20 points, Ride / Manners = max 20 points, Conformation = max 20 points. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft 9ins) at the discretion of the Judges. (This class is a qualifying class for the Royal International Horse Show).

Qualifiers;

"ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW" ("RIHS").

Class 24: SHB(GB) Working Hunter, is a qualifier for The Agria Royal International Horse Show. The two highest placed horses will qualify, no horse lower than 2nd will qualify. In working hunter classes the two highest placed horses from each class will go through to the Working Hunter Championship and all these four horses will qualify for RIHS if they have not already done so. RIHS Qualification will not pass down the line beyond the aforementioned placings. In the Working Hunter Championship, Judges must place all horses to determine qualification.

Only horses registered with SHB (GB) and who are also registered on the current year's Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter in Qualifying Classes for RIHS Ridden and Working Hunter Championships and the Show Hunter Registration Number must be quoted on entries. Any horse that is entered for a Qualifying Class without first being on the Show Hunter Register cannot subsequently be registered and therefore will not be eligible for entry in that class on the day and will be disqualified if forward.

DAY TICKETS - Competitors may compete on a day ticket and may have a maximum of two Day Tickets per season. Each day ticket is valid for the entirety of the show (this covers all SHB(GB) Classes that require a membership and registration) and it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration/over-stamp for that show. As a qualifying class for RIHS in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration/ over-stamp must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days.

The 1st, 2nd & 3rd placed competitors in class 24 will qualify for the UK PONIES & HORSES Open Hunter Finals at the UK Ponies & Horses Limited Spring Classic 2026. (Rider any age). UK Ponies and Horses Ltd: Registration 25/A18/8370.

This Show is affiliated to Equifest. - 2) Data Protection: It is a condition of entry that the SSAA reserves the right to forward Exhibitor information to the press, Breed Societies and other regulatory bodies (ie DEFRA or Trading Standards). It is also a requirement that the Owner's name will be published in the Show Catalogue. No address details will be listed in the catalogue.
- 3) Equine Influenza: It is expected that all horses and ponies competing should have been vaccinated against equine flu before the show, but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show. The Association's Veterinary Officer will carry out regular checks of the Horse Section and the Stewards, at their direction are empowered to require any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine flu to be immediately removed from the showground. In the event of a serious outbreak the Association reserves the right to require Vaccination certificates to be produced.
- 4) The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 5) The entry fee for any animal entered and not exhibited will be forfeited. Entry fees in respect of all entry cancellations owing to accident or illness will be refunded in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 79.5 and requires confirmation in writing of the cancellation.
- 6) Entries close on Friday 25th April 2025. <u>No</u> entries will be accepted on the day. NO SUBSTITUTIONS or class changes allowed after printing of the catalogue WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE BRITISH SHOWJUMPING CLASSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 79.3. - **18)** The playing of ball games or participation in any activity that may excite an animal is **strictly not allowed** within the horse and livestock lines or those areas set aside as practice or exercise areas.

- 20) In the event of a competitor, or anyone connected with a competitor, being guilty of improper or abusive behaviour towards his or her animal, any Official of the Association or the general public, the Chairman, Secretary or Show Steward shall have the power to order the offender to leave the Showground and recommend that the Show shall refuse that person's entry for future shows.
- 21) The Association reserves the sole right of decision to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the show. Where such decisions arise, from directive, happenings or circumstances outside the control of the Association, it shall not create liability to claim for loss or damage. The refund of fees will be at the discretion of the Association.
- 22) Disclaimer of Liability: In this clause, the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Committee, and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents, the Committee will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his servant or agent or to any animal, article,

plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to Showground by the said exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises.

Save as aforesaid the exhibitor shall indemnify the Committee against all claims, damages, and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the exhibitor, his servant, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the Showground and shall assume full responsibility therefore.

Exhibitors must have insurance against any third party claims and acknowledge that they are taking part in a risk sport and that they are a competent person within the level of competition, which they are about to or be taking part in. Acceptance of the foregoing provision shall be a condition of entry.
