No substitutions or class changes allowed after printing of the catalogue, with the exception of the British Showjumping classes in accordance with rule 79.3. The Association will not be responsible for any entry being made in the wrong class.

THEREAFTER, ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY SUBJECT TO;

- **Full admission to the showground being purchased at the gates for all those accompanying the horse / pony onto the showground, unless already in receipt of an admission ticket.**
- **Increased entry fees to apply.**
- **Entry must be completed in person at the Equine Office, full rider, owner and animal details given, entry fee paid and number collected prior to competing.**
- **Qualifiers will be stripped from those awarded on the day who are later found not to have met the eligibility criteria for qualifying, such as registration with the appropriate association, and handed down to the next eligible entrant retrospectively.**

Equine Influenza

Horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show. Random checks of Passports within the Horse section will be carried out by the Association's Veterinary Officer and Senior Stewards, The Association requires that all exhibits are disease free and come from a healthy environment and any horse or pony found to be showing clinical signs of equine flu will be immediately removed from the showground.

Safety

The Organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

It is mandatory for all riders to wear correct riding clothes including a protective helmet manufactured to conform with current approved BSI or European Standards with the chinstrap correctly and securely fastened at all times whilst mounted on the showground. The Club accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.

Riding is only permitted on the routes to and from the rings, in the rings or horse lines, practice area and warm up ring. **When not competing horses must be kept away from all rings.**

(Affiliated to the Donkey Breed Society)

Judging to commence at 8.30 am

Class

- 1 Best Condition and Turned Out: Donkeys of any age and sex, to be judged 75% condition and 25% turnout. Conformation will not be taken into account.
- 2 Mare, 4 years old and over, and broodmare, 5 years old and over with own foal at foot, foals to be 6 weeks old or over on show day.
- 3 Colt or gelding, two or three years old.
- 4 Filly, two or three years old.
- 5 Yearling colt, gelding or filly.

Please note, if there are insufficient entries forward in the Youngstock classes, these classes may be amalgamated into one class for colts and geldings and one class for fillies.

- 6 Stallion or gelding, four years old or over.
- 7 Veteran Donkey, for donkeys that are 20 years of age or over.
- 8 CHAMPIONSHIP: For 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 2 to 6. Classes are open to everyone whether or not they are members of the Donkey Breed Society, but DBS rosettes can only be awarded to exhibits owned by DBS members.

Qualifiers

The In-Hand Champion Donkey at this show automatically qualifies for the relevant Championship at the DBS Annual Supreme Championship Show on 22nd August 2026 at Moreton Morrell College, Warwickshire, provided it is owned by a fully paid up member of the DBS. A donkey may win more than one Championship at shows but will qualify only once for the DBS Championship Show. Where the In-Hand Champion donkey has previously qualified, the Reserve Champion Donkey will be deemed the Qualifier. If the Reserve Champion has also previously qualified, the judge will select another donkey from the In-Hand Championship line up as the qualifier for the DBS Annual Supreme Championship Show.

Awards

The DBS presents:

A "Best Veteran" rosette for the winner of class 7,

A "Best Local Donkey" rosette to the best donkey owned by a DBS member living within a 25mile radius of the showground, to be judged after the In-Hand Championship. Eligible competitors are asked to wear a coloured armband (preferably BLUE).

The SSAA presents;

The *MOULTON Challenge Trophy* awarded to the Champion Donkey in the show.

All entries for In Hand classes must be registered in or eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix.

All foals must be eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section A of the UK Suffolk Stud Book. Both the sire and the dam must be registered and entered in the pedigree section A of the UK Suffolk Stud Book.

All stallions must be registered in the Pedigree Section A of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number, stallion licence number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. Discretionary entry to a stallion class may be allowed in cases where a licence is pending but not yet issued.

All owners entering their horses must be members of the Suffolk Horse Society.

Classes 9 – 13 and 15 are qualifiers for championship points for the annually awarded trophies; The Centenary Perpetual Challenge Cup, The Robert Peacock Trophy, The Brian Cooper Perpetual Trophy, The Cherrytrees George Murray Trophy (stallions only) and The Jenkins Youth Trophy for Young Handlers, and for the Supreme Suffolk Horse Championship.

28 LOCAL NOVICE WORKING HUNTER

Open to mares, geldings or stallions stabled within 30 miles of the showground, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, not having won a first prize of £60 or a total of £200 (or equivalent values) in prize money in any SHB(GB) affiliated Working Hunter Classes at home or abroad, before 1st January in the current year, excepting all prize money awarded as a four year old. Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by the 1st January of the current year.

Class

29 RIHS SHB(GB) WORKING HUNTER

A mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white, and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.). This class to be judged in accordance with the rules for Working Hunter Competitions as laid down by SHB(GB). To be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out. Grade A Showjumpers and Advanced Event horses are not eligible to compete in these Classes. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as of 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes.

The maximum total points available are 100. These are made up of: Jumping points = max 40 points, Style & Presence whilst Jumping = max 20 points, Ride / Manners = max 20 points, Conformation = max 20 points. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft 9ins) at the discretion of the Judges. **(This class is a qualifying class for the Royal International Horse Show).**

Qualifiers;

“ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW” (“RIHS”).

DIRECT ROUTE QUALIFIERS – Are open to Members and Non-members HOWEVER, to claim the LIHS ticket a competitor MUST already be a 2026 member. The members MUST produce the membership card or a covering letter from the SSADL Show office to be able to claim the LIHS Ticket. The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same for the Grand Final. No substitutions will be accepted. For a competitor to be eligible to compete at the LIHS Senior Showing Grand Final at the ExCel, ALL ponies/horses MUST meet the current FEI Vaccination Regulations.

NOTE -ONCE A COMPETITOR HAS QUALIFIED FOR LIHS IN THE RIDDEN SECTION, THEY ARE NOT ALLOWED TO QUALIFY IN THE IN-HAND SECTION AND VICE VERSA.

Competitors MUST produce both the above cards at the ring side before entry NO CARDS NO ENTRY

No Spurs- with the exception of adult side saddle riders, no galloping/canter extensions, no wearing of face/body jewellery, with the exception to the earring used by competitors with health problems. Foals are NOT permitted in SSADL classes.

FOR IN HAND CLASSES: Minimum age of handler = 11yrs

First Ridden ponies/riders will be asked after the initial walk round to come into the centre of the ring. First Ridden Competitors will only canter in their individual shows. Lead Rein & First Ridden competitors: Strip section both lead rein and First Ridden rider MUST stay mounted.

STALLIONS: Either In-Hand or Ridden competitors must be over the age of 16 years. Competitors cannot enter the ring once the command of trot has been given.

Grooms must be 16 years of age and over and correctly dressed.

Judges are NOT allowed to groom for a SSADL competitor.

The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same from qualifier to Grand Finals, unless special circumstances should arise, then it will be left to the discretion of the Directors and Advisory Committee to oversee this rule if required.

The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same whether side saddle or astride from First/Second or Direct Route Qualifiers and Grand Final.

SSADL AGE BADGES MUST BE WORN BY MEMBERS, FAILURE TO DO SO WILL DEEM DISQUALIFICATION.

ALL STALLIONS MUST WEAR THE SSADL STALLION BADGE.

Competitors cannot enter the ring once the command of trot has been given. The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same whether side saddle or astride from first/second or direct route qualifiers and grand final.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

- 1) Every exhibitor making entries for the show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Conditions of Entry, and it is only on this understanding that entries are accepted.
- 2) All entries for inclusion in the show catalogue must be made either in writing to the Secretary on the requisite form and accompanied by the necessary entry fees or online via www.southsuffolkshow.co.uk.
- 3) Entries for inclusion in the show catalogue close on Friday 24th April 2026. No substitutions or class changes allowed after printing of the catalogue, with the exception of the British Show jumping classes in accordance with rule 79.3. The Association will not be responsible for any entry being made in the wrong class.
- 4) All entries on the day must be made in person at the Equine Office (situated in-front of ring 6). Full rider, owner and animal details are to be given, entry fee paid and number collected prior to competing.
- 5) The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 6) The entry fee for any animal entered and not exhibited will be forfeited. Entry fees in respect of all entry cancellations owing to accident or illness will be refunded in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 79.5 and requires confirmation in writing of the cancellation.
- 7) Ponies competing in this show shall be deemed to be subject to the Rules and Regulations of the relevant affiliated Association/Society under which the class/s are being held.
- 8) Competitors may be disqualified from any class for not observing the rules or causing unnecessary delay to the continuity of the show. A fall of horse/pony or rider in any class will result in disqualification and the rider must leave the ring dismounted. (It is strongly recommended that medical advice be sought before competing in any other class.)
- 9) Qualifiers will be stripped from those awarded on the day who are later found not to have met the eligibility criteria for qualifying, such as registration with the appropriate association, and handed down to the next eligible entrant retrospectively.
- 10) i) All exhibitors entering the showground, including riders, owners, grooms and drivers of horseboxes/trailers must have a valid admission entrance ticket or pay the full price of admission at the gate (£20) to gain access to the showground. This regulation will be strictly enforced. The show will not take responsibility for any tickets, which may have been mislaid or forgotten. No refunds will be considered unless application is made in writing to the Secretary. All persons on leaving the showground who wish to re-enter must obtain a pass from the gate stewards. No Pass - No Re-Entry unless the admission fee is paid.
ii) Complimentary exhibitor admission tickets for those who have entered prior to the catalogue deadline will be sent by email in advance of the show, based on the following allocation criteria;

Additional admission tickets may be sent at the discretion of the show if more than 6 animals have been entered, and if requested in writing to the Secretary by 24th April 2026, thereafter additional tickets may be purchased from the website www.southsuffolkshow.co.uk.

iii) All owners making exhibit applications through an agent prior to the catalogue deadline and who wish to attend the show will be required to apply in writing to the Secretary by 24th April 2026 for issue of an exhibitor's admission ticket.

iv) For exhibitors entering on the day full admission to the showground must be purchased at the gates for all those accompanying the horse / pony onto the showground, unless already in receipt of an admission ticket.

- 11) Horseboxes/trailers and cars carrying tack in support of boxes/trailers must enter the showground through the horsebox entrance and be parked as directed by stewards.
- 12) Numbers are to be collected from the Equine Office (situated in-front of ring 6) on show day.
- 13) No timetable of events will be issued and changes may be made to ring allocations. The Association will not be responsible for exhibits not arriving on time to be judged.

- 14) If, for any reason, a judge is unable to attend the show or is more than 30 minutes late, the Association reserves the right to appoint a Deputy. Every effort will be made to inform exhibitors.
- 15) Horses must be walked from the Horsebox parking area to the working in area, collection and show rings, by the horse walkways and defined routes. **NO TROTGING OR CANTERING WILL BE ALLOWED in walkways or defined routes.** Any breach of this rule may result in the offender being asked to leave the show.
- 16) Horses when not competing must be kept away from all rings.
- 17) The playing of ball games or participation in any activity that may excite an animal is **strictly not allowed** within the horse and livestock lines or those areas set aside as practice or exercise areas.
- 18) It is mandatory for all riders to wear correct riding clothes including a protective helmet manufactured to conform with current approved BSI or European Standards with the chinstrap correctly and securely fastened at all times whilst mounted on the showground. The Club accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.
- 19) The Organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone should take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents and must obey the instructions of the Show Committee and all the Officials and Stewards.
- 20) i) Prize money will be paid on the day up to 5.30pm, by the Treasurer, only on receipt of the prize card issued in the Ring. Prizes not claimed by this time will be settled by cheque within 28 days on receipt of the relevant prize card by the show.
(iii) Should insufficient entries be received for any one class, the Organisers reserve the right to combine two or more classes forward on the Show day.
(iv) Classes 17a to 22 are held under British Showjumping Rules and in the event of insufficient starters lower prizes may be withheld in accordance with Rule 76.6.
(v) Winners must sign for their Cup or Trophy at the Secretary's Office before taking them from the Showground. All Cup/Trophy winners will be required to return them on request before the next Show. **Special Note:** Competitors are advised that due to past difficulties, any cup won may be collected and signed for only by the winner or member of his/her immediate family.
- 21) Objections must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of £10 handed to the Secretary within five minutes of the finish of the event concerned (or £100 for objections in British Showjumping classes).
- 22) In the event of a competitor, or anyone connected with a competitor, being guilty of improper or abusive behaviour towards his or her animal, any Official of the Association or the general public, the Chairman, Secretary or Show Steward shall have the power to order the offender to leave the Showground and recommend that the Show shall refuse that person's entry for future shows.
- 23) The Association reserves the sole right of decision to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the show. Where such decisions arise, from directive, happenings or circumstances outside the control of the Association, it shall not create liability to claim for loss or damage. The refund of fees will be at the discretion of the Association.
- 24) **Data Protection:** It is a condition of entry that the SSAA reserves the right to forward Exhibitor information to the press, Breed Societies and other regulatory bodies (ie DEFRA or Trading Standards). It is also a requirement that the Owner's name will be published in the Show Catalogue. No address details will be listed in the catalogue.
- 25) **Equine Influenza:** It is expected that all horses and ponies competing should have been vaccinated against equine flu before the show, but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show. The Association's Veterinary Officer will carry out regular checks of the Horse Section and the Stewards, at their direction are empowered to require any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine flu to be immediately removed from the showground. In the event of a serious outbreak the Association reserves the right to require Vaccination certificates to be produced.
- 26) **Disclaimer of Liability:** In this clause, the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Committee, and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground.
Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents, the Committee will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his servant or agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to Showground by the said exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises.
Save as aforesaid the exhibitor shall indemnify the Committee against all claims, damages, and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the exhibitor, his servant, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the Showground and shall assume full responsibility therefore.
Exhibitors must have insurance against any third party claims and acknowledge that they are taking part in a risk sport and that they are a competent person within the level of competition, which they are about to or be taking part in. Acceptance of the foregoing provision shall be a condition of entry.
